ETHICS SUBMITTED

An ethics application was submitted at BC Children's Hospital and is now undergoing minimal-risk review. The application aims to capture 100% of Canadian BA patients. Based on our previous study, we expect to identify 22-25 BA cases across Canada each year. To achieve our goals, it is critical that the registry captures all patients. Following approval, a template IRB form will be created for other sites to follow.
