BA RESEARCH NEWS

A recent study by Schreiber et al. studied the costeffectiveness of a homebased BA Infant Stool Colour Card screening program. Healthy newborns were recruited at BC Women's Hospital with instructions to monitor stool colour and return the stool colour card by mail. 6187 families were enrolled and participation rates were between 60-94%. The program was found to be feasible and cost-effective in a Canadian population. The program has now been implemented across BC.
